#### **Katy Newell-Jones** - *Of Feed the Minds on Effectively Partnering Local Literacy Organisations*

Feed the Minds is a UK-based NGO supporting a range of indigenous NGOs undertaking community-based projects with a literacy component. This presentation will explore some of the challenges and successes in developing these partnerships in conflict-affected communities and strengthening the literacy component of programmes.

Katy has been involved in adult literacy for 25 years as a tutor, trainer, programme manager and evaluator with experience in literacy in conflict and post-conflict scenarios, particularly South Sudan and Sierra Leone. Katy holds fellowships at Oxford and Oxford Brookes University.
